BRC Rule Book 2020

Rule G5.2 Riders' Age

All riders in senior competitions must be 18 or over on 1st January in the current year. All riders in junior competitions must be under 18 on 1st January in the current year.

Rule G6.1.2 Height of Horses

It is accepted that in BRC competitions senior members may ride ponies and junior members may ride horses.

Kennaa Riding Club Showjumping Rules 2020

British Riding Clubs (BRC) recommends that club show jumping is run to British Showjumping (BS) standard. Kennaa Riding Club is working towards this standard.

KRC showjumping will now run, in the main, as per BS rules with a few exceptions where the following BRC rules remain:

1. BRC competition rules, appendix four, dress guidelines: *“Hair must be neatly secured and **must not** hang lower than the shoulder when standing normally.”*
2. Where the permitted tack differs between BS and BRC both will be allowed
3. Scoring: faults will remain in accordance with BRC scoring for showjumping

SJ1.11.1 Jumping and Time Penalties (BRC 2020 rulebook page 57):

<i>Knocking down any part of an obstacle including the wing</i>	<i>4 faults</i>
<i>First disobedience on the whole course</i>	<i>4 faults</i>
<i>Second disobedience on the whole course</i>	<i>8 faults</i>
<i>Third disobedience on the whole course</i>	<i>Elimination</i>
<i>First fall of a rider on the whole course</i>	<i>Elimination</i>
<i>Fall of horse</i>	<i>Elimination</i>
<i>Every second commenced over time allowed</i>	<i>1 time penalty</i>

NB: The six-second time penalty rule (BS and BRC), incurred when an obstacle (single or part of a combination) is displaced as a result of a disobedience, will be used in classes where the first round is timed.

4. **NEW FOR 2020: BRC 2020 rulebook, page 100:** *One whip is permitted and must be between 45cm and 70cm and must not be weighted or with a hard point at the end. The end of the whip must be padded. The “pad” must be smooth with no protrusion or raised surface (which includes embroidery), and be made of a shock absorbing material throughout its circumference.*
5. **The BS whip rule will be applied at Kennaa showjumping.** *(BS 2020 handbook, section 2.103 abuse of horses rule 4, page 107).* The rule, in part, states: *“the whip should be used **no more than** three times after entering the arena. The arm should not come above the shoulder.”* There will be no differentiation between seniors and juniors; in addition BS states **that horses and ponies may not be hit before the start.**

Although BRC rules, in general, mirror BS rules there are some minor differences. Should one of these, not covered here, come into question common sense will be applied. If necessary, the decision will be at the judge's discretion.

For those travelling to compete in BRC competitions in the UK, it is always recommended that the rider is familiar with BRC rules in full. For example, two key differences are:

- i. *“Crossing the start line in the correct direction at an outdoor competition before the bell results in elimination”*
- ii. In 2020, combination martingales (standing and running in one martingale) are permitted.

Please note that you must wear a correctly fitting and compliant hat and the hat must have a chin strap securely fastened at all times when mounted. Body protectors are strongly recommended but not obligatory (**See BRC 2020 rulebook, section G22**, for current hat and body protector guidelines).

KENNAA RIDING CLUB COVID-19 CONTROL MEASURES

As of 22nd June 2020

Club events will be run in accordance with the government's Covid-19 control measures in force at the time. In summary the key points, as of 22nd June, are:

- If you feel unwell, particularly with flu-like symptoms, do not attend the event
- Online entries are preferred, via My Riding Life. Cash entries/entries on the day may not be accepted
- Start times will be allocated for every event type. The committee will make every effort to run to time, so please keep to your allocated time
- There will be no access to the indoor facilities at Kennaa Equestrian Centre (eg toilets, vending machines, clubhouse)
- There will be no catering, unless otherwise stated on the schedule
- Hygiene stations will be available at key locations. Please use them if you enter the warm-up arenas on foot or touch any of Kennaa's equipment, eg poo-picking kit
- Plan for one groom/helper per competitor
- Tack-up and un-tack in/by your lorry in the car park, while observing the social distancing you feel comfortable with
- The number of horses allowed in the warm-up arenas may be limited, depending on entry numbers
- If you or a family member/friend plans to attend an event as a spectator, please follow social distancing measures you feel comfortable with. If the number of people at an event (including judges, stewards, riders and grooms) appears to exceed any government limits on gatherings, you may be asked to leave.
