Kennaa Riding Club Showjumping Rules 2021

British Riding Clubs (BRC) recommends that club show jumping is run to British Showjumping (BS) standard. Kennaa Riding Club is working towards this standard.

KRC showjumping will now run, in the main, as per BS rules with a few exceptions where the following BRC rules remain:

1. BRC competition rules, appendix four, dress guidelines: "Hair must be neatly secured and must not hang lower than the shoulder when standing normally."
2. Where the permitted tack differs between BS and BRC both will be allowed
3. Scoring: faults will remain in accordance with BRC scoring for showjumping

SJ1.11.1 Jumping and Time Penalties (BRC 2020 rulebook page 57):

Knocking down any part of an obstacle including the wing	4 Faults
First disobedience on the whole course	4 Faults
Second disobedience on the whole course	8 Faults
Third disobedience on the whole course	Elimination
First fall of a rider on the whole course	Elimination
Fall of horse	Elimination

NB: The six-second time penalty rule (BS and BRC), incurred when an obstacle (single or part of a combination) is displaced as a result of a disobedience, will be used in classes where the first round is timed.

4. BRC 2021: One whip is permitted and must be between 45cm and 70cm and must not be weighted or with a hard point at the end. The end of the whip must be padded. The "pad" must be smooth with no protrusion or raised surface (which includes embroidery), and be made of a shock absorbing material throughout its circumference.
5. The BS whip rule will be applied at Kennaa showjumping. (BS 2020 handbook, section 2.103 abuse of horses rule 4, page 107). The rule, in part, states: "the whip should be used no more than three times after entering the arena. The arm should not come above the shoulder." There will be no differentiation between seniors and juniors; in addition BS states that horses and ponies may not be hit before the start.

Although BRC rules, in general, mirror BS rules there are some minor differences. Should one of these, not covered here, come into question common sense will be applied. If necessary, the decision will be at the judge's discretion.

For those travelling to compete in BRC competitions in the UK, it is always recommended that the rider is familiar with BRC rules in full. For example, two key differences are:

- i. "Crossing the start line in the correct direction at an outdoor competition before the bell results in elimination"
- ii. In 2020, combination martingales (standing and running in one martingale) are permitted.
